Program formats

Abstracts will be accepted for the following types of session to be held at the 2nd International Conference of Community Psychology.

Type	Description
Panel Presentation	This is an individual oral presentation. The presentations received will be grouped into panels based on similarity of content. Each panel will include a maximum of 3 persons.
Organized Symposium	A symposium should be composed of three presentations selected by the submitting author. It should provide a debate of diverse perspectives concerning significant issues in the field and allow significant time for questions and discussion.
Roundtable Discussions	A roundtable discussion is a lead discussion of a specific topic or issue. It may be led by one or more presenters who will actively interact with participants and facilitate the audience participation. The preparation of a set of questions to guide the discussion is recommended.
Workshops	A workshop may be taught by one or more instructors. This format is especially appropriate to share expertise and teach new skills of relevance to the field.
Innovative Sessions	Innovative sessions will provide opportunities to address issues of relevance to community psychology in innovative ways or unusual session formats, to facilitate exchange and interaction among participants.
Poster Presentations	Posters should emphasize substantive research results. During poster sessions, authors will be present to discuss their work informally with the public.

Guidelines for submitting proposals

- Closing date for submissions is 28 Feb. 2008. No submissions will be accepted after this date.
- Abstracts should be submitted through the "Submit Now" online facility (www.2iccp.com).
 - All submitted abstracts will be acknowledged within 10 working days of receipt.
 - All proposals will be reviewed by at least two members of the Scientific Committee.
 - Authors will be notified by e-mail or regular mail by the end of March 2008 regarding whether submissions were accepted.
 - One individual should not submit more than two presentations as a primary author and no more than four presentations (including roles as moderator, discussant, or co-author) altogether.
 - Official languages are English, Portuguese and Spanish.
- All proposals and handouts must be in English.
- There will be simultaneous translation at most sessions.
