Peter recently managed VicHealth's Reducing Race-Based Discrimination and Social Connections programs, working with networks of other organisations to reduce the negative health impacts of racial discrimination in the arts, sports clubs, workplaces and local community settings.

As the Director of his own small business, Community Stars, he specialises in helping organisations design, fund, manage and evaluate exciting, pragmatic projects that are grounded in solid evidence. Some of the projects Peter initiated have won state and national awards and have been replicated by others.

Peter also recently released a book on psychological and emotional abuse, lectures at Victoria University, supervises other psychologists and sits on two ethics boards.
