KidsMatter, in partnership with highly regarded Aboriginal consultants, has developed a series of animations and guidance resources that are designed to support the social and emotional wellbeing of Aboriginal children and provide participants with an understanding of what social and emotional wellbeing means to Aboriginal people. Each animation provides a story that highlights key messages about the day-to-day caring of Aboriginal children's wellbeing by parents, families and communities.

Aboriginal cultural consultants were engaged from the beginning of the project and worked closely with the KidsMatter team to develop the concepts, scripts and key messages of the animations. Members of the project team, including the cultural consultants, will share their experience of the project, as part of a discussion following the 60-minute screening of the 12 animations.
